- What on the first page keeps you reading
- Which character are you most curious about?
- Tell me the story in your own words
- How do the characters change from the beginning of the story to the end?
- Which character changes most in the story?
- Which character has not changed?
- How would the story be different if...?
- Which character would you want to be your friend?
- Is there a character you dislike?
- If you could invite one character to dinner, who would it be?
- Who is the most important character in the story?
- Who is telling the story? How would another character tell the story?
- How would the story be different it a boy/girl told the story?
- What would you do in this situation?
- What title would you give the story?
- Using only eight words, what is the plot of this story? Do you like the ending of the story? If not, How would you end the story?
- Does the ending fit the story?
- Does the story call for a sequel?
- What other books does this story make you think of?
- What are you curious about at the end of the story?
