

Why do we use STAR?


(For Teachers)

Listening STAR Tasks (during class suspension)

- · as Listening assignments during school suspension
- similar topics as those in the textbook e.g. student & school life, food, animals, etc.
- recycling of focused vocabulary
- from KS 2 (P.6) to KS3 (S.3) questions, easy to difficult
- Reports serve as records for follow-up
- · Data reflect students' abilities


