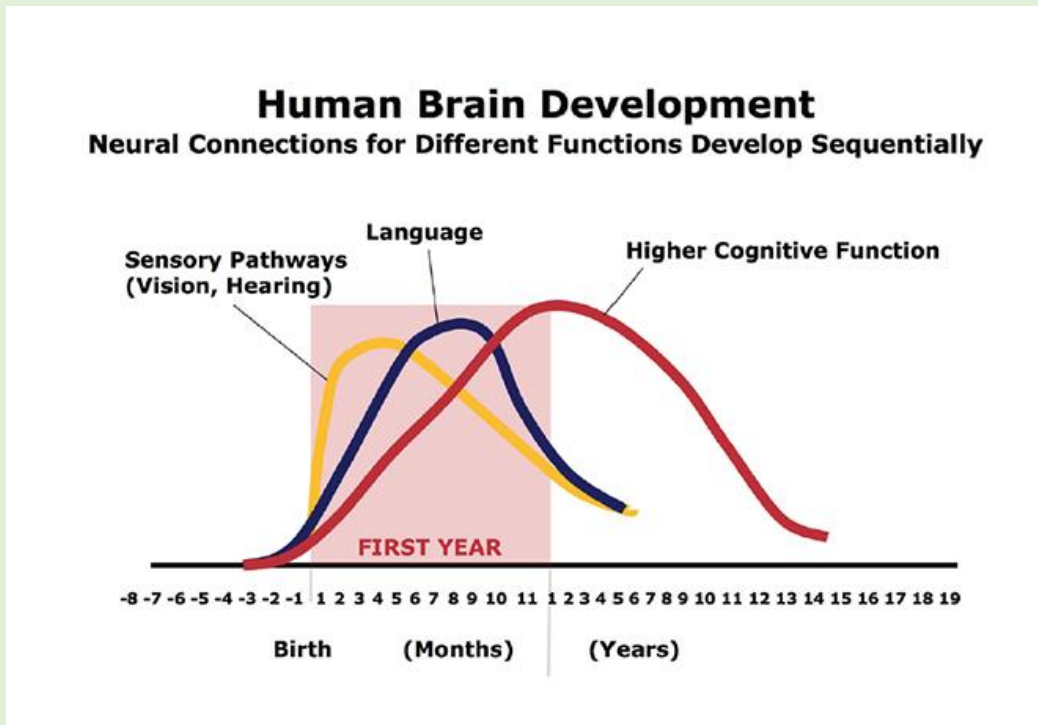

A pop-up storybook workshop

A one-day creative arts workshop, *Storybook Production Workshop: Your own pop-up storybook*, was conducted in August 2019 with eight participants (children aged 7–9; 8 girls) as part of a summer program in the Centre for Advancement in Inclusive and Special Education at the University of Hong Kong.

During the workshop, children were taught the two core aspects of creative expression: narrative techniques conceptually and pop-up effects in creating a storybook physically. Children created their own storyline with a sequence of scenes on the storyboard and illustrations in the pop-up book.





A pop-up storybook workshop

The role of storybooks has been recognized by previous literature as an educational resource for promoting young children's cognitive development (Chiong and DeLoache, 2013).

Scholars further have examined the applications of pop-up storybooks and reveal that pop-up book experiences are effective to improve children's cognitive ability (Rukiyati, 2018).

In this workshop, through demonstrating the techniques of pop-up design, children's creative narrations and visual power from the pop-up effects showed in their storybooks. Most importantly, children's senses of humor are infused into the storybook. Children expressed their humor attempts (e.g. jokes, funny behaviors) (Bergen, 2014) through the pop-up storybooks.

Bunny X Bear Bakery

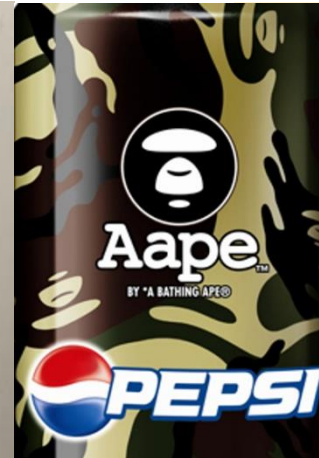

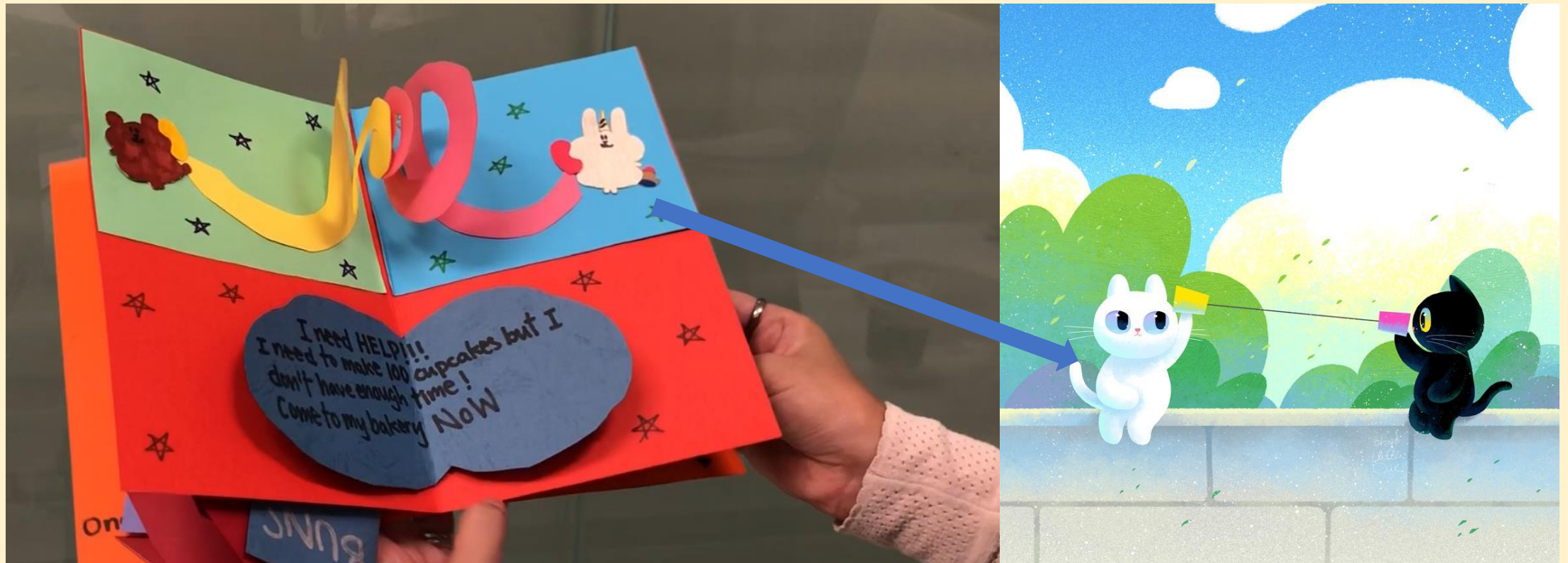

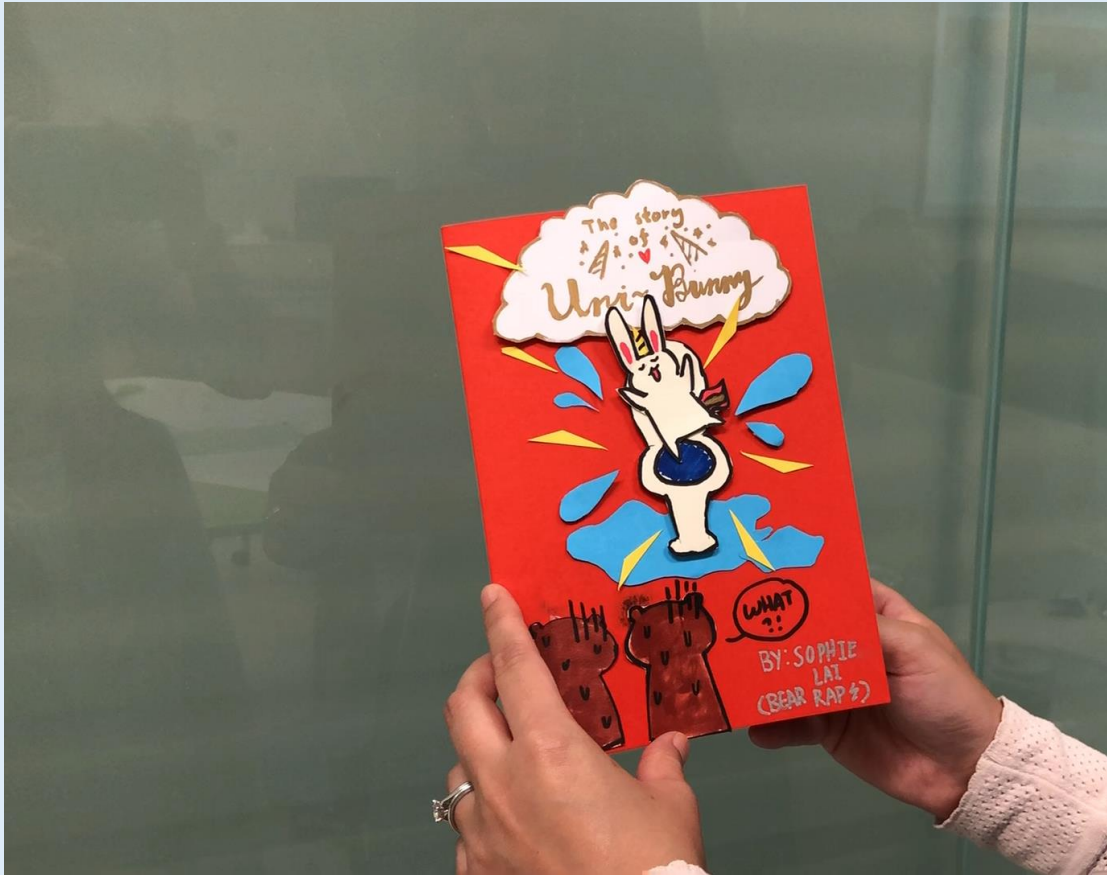

Peek-a-boo: a game played with very young children in which you hide your face



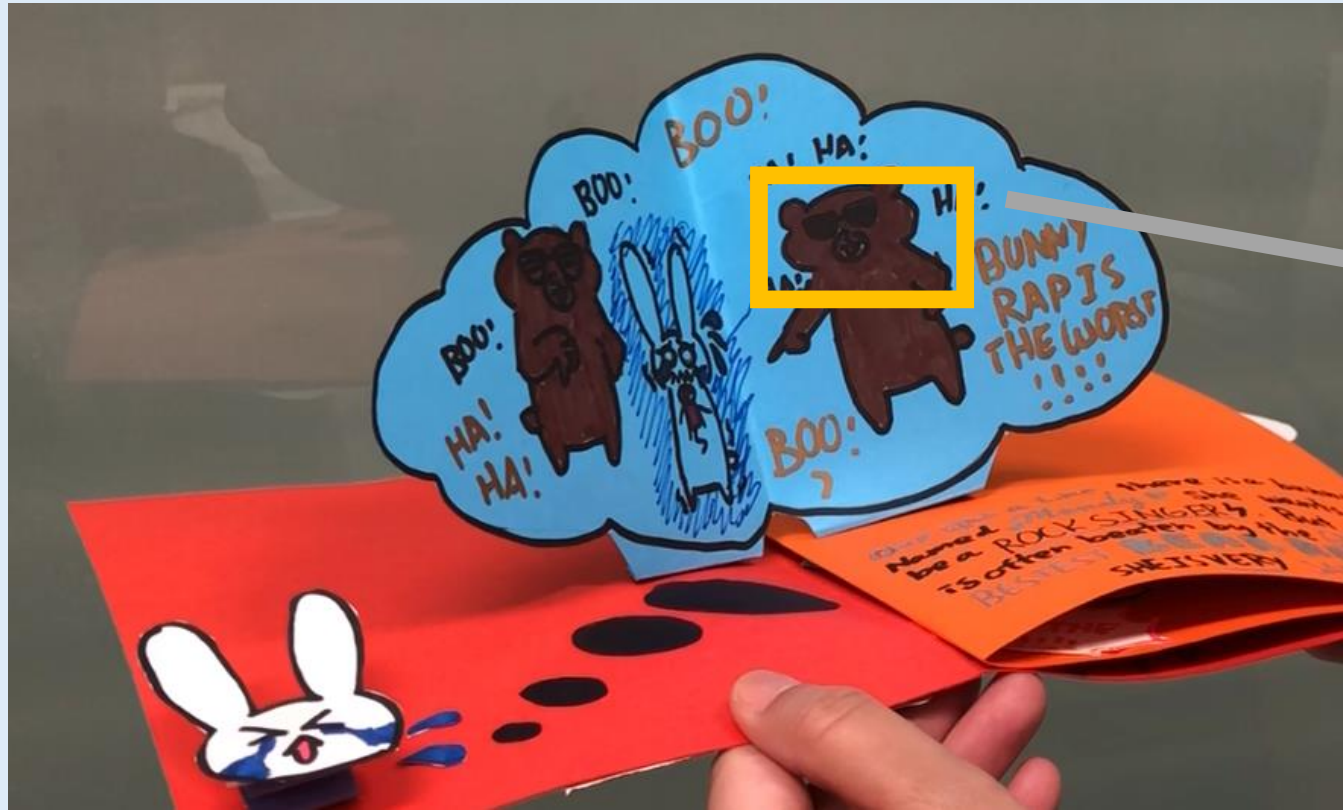

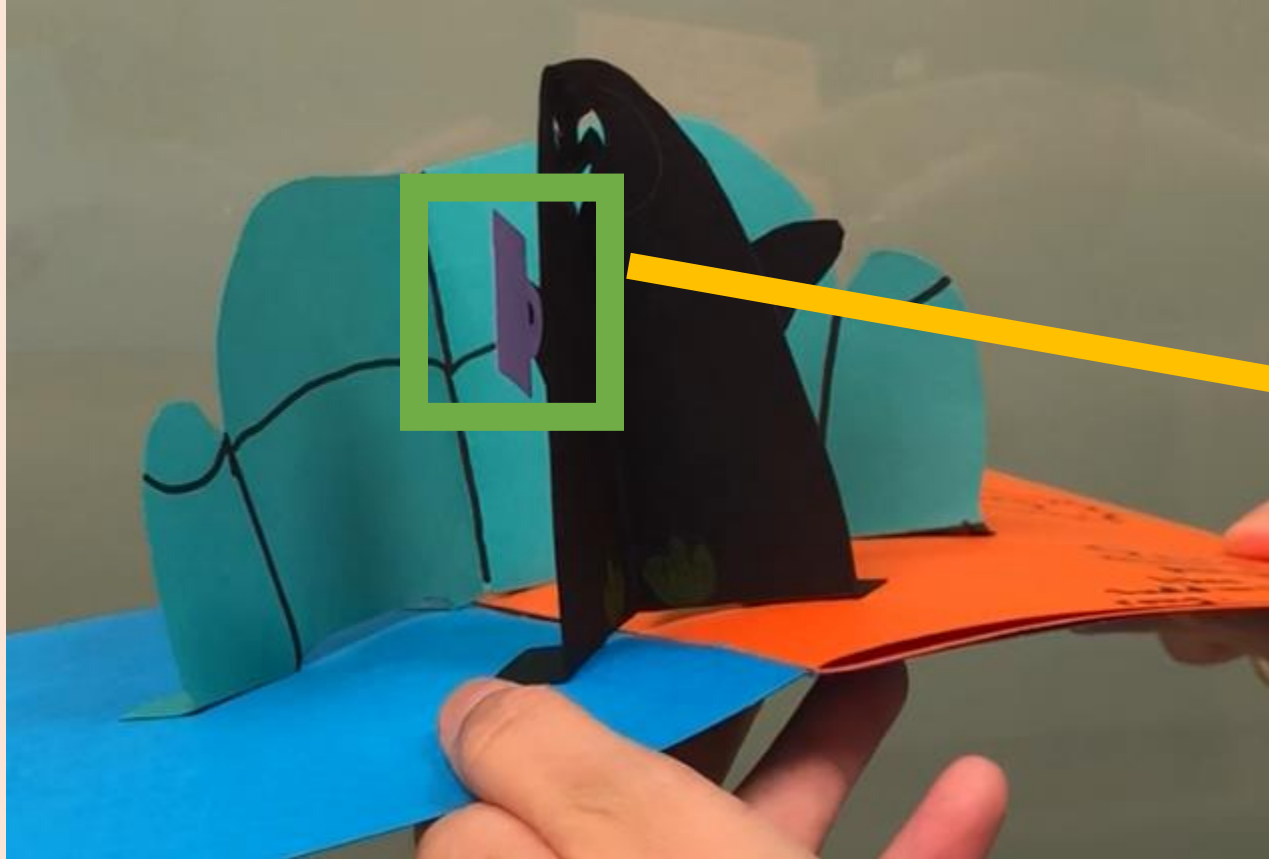

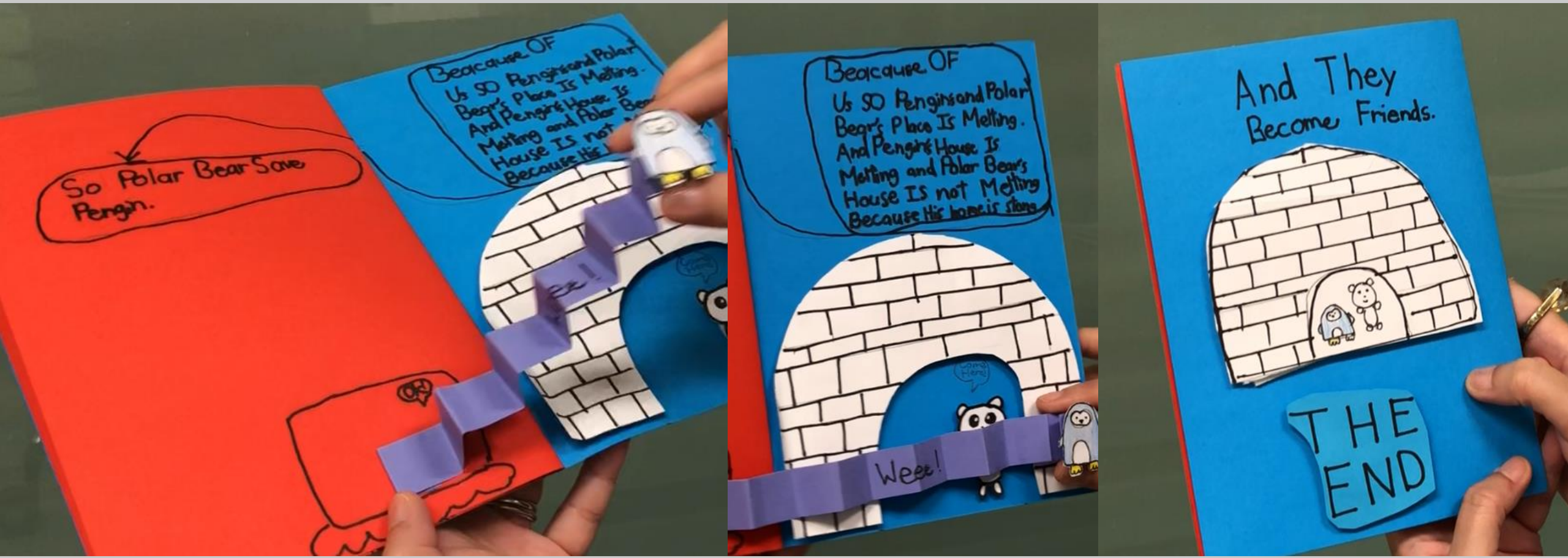
